The Legal Services (LS) department is a part of Business & Sector Development Services Division of the Small Medium Enterprises Development Authority and plays a key role in providing an overall facilitation and support to the small businesses. The LS believes that information dissemination among the small businesses on the existing legal & regulatory environment and business to business and business to client contracting is of paramount importance and plays a pivotal role in their sustainable development.

In order to facilitate small businesses, the LS, under the Pro-GOLE (Right to do business) project, a joint SMEDA-UNDP initiative for supporting the small businesses, has developed user-friendly contract templates.

The UNDP has partnered with the Small and Medium Enterprises Development Authority to initiate and execute the Pillar 4 (Right to do business) component of the UNDP PRO-GOLE project which seeks to enhance the legal awareness and mobility of marginalized/ informal businesses. 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3. REPRESENTATIONS AND WARRANTIES

- (1) The Assignor represents and warrants to the Assignee:
 - i. that the Assignor has the right, power and authority to enter into this Agreement;
 - ii. that the Assignor is the exclusive owner of all right, title and interest, including all intellectual property rights, in the Copyrights;
 - iii. that the Copyrights are free of any liens, security interests, encumbrances or licenses;
 - iv. that the Copyrights do not infringe the rights of any person or entity;
 - v. that there are no claims, pending or threatened, with respect to Assignor's rights in the Copyrights;
 - vi. that the Assignor is not subject to any agreement, judgment or order inconsistent with the terms of this Agreement.

4. GOVERNING LAW AND EXCLUSIVE JURISDICTION

5. RESOLUTION OF DISPUTES

6. FORCE MAJEURE

(1) Force Majeure shall mean any event that is beyond the reasonable control of a Party, or the effects of which adversely affect the performance by such Party of its obligations under this Agreement, including, but not limited to, acts of God, sabotage, insurrection, terrorism, riots, hostilities or war (whether declared or not), acts of the

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public enemy, civil disturbances, any kind of fire, explosion, flood or accidental damage, epidemics, landslides, washouts, lightening, storms, earthquakes, lockouts, blockades, shortage of labor or material, major equipment failure, or other causes beyond the control of the Party affected.

- (2) Notwithstanding anything contained hereinabove, neither Party shall be liable to the other if it is unable to perform any of its obligations under this Agreement due to the occurrence of Force Majeure.
- (3) The Party affected by the Force Majeure event shall be entitled to suspend performance of its obligations under the Agreement to the extent that such performance is impeded or made impossible by the events of Force Majeure.
- (4) Each Party shall give a notice within [insert number] days of the occurrence of the event of Force Majeure and shall promptly thereafter consult the other Party for the purpose of finding a mutually acceptable solution to the Force Majeure event.

7. INDEMNIFICATION

If either party is found to be in breach of this Agreement, the offending Party will indemnify the offended Party for any losses accrued as a result of the breach. Lost profits incurred as a result of any such breach shall be repaid by the offending Party to the offended Party.

8. AMENDMENTS

This Agreement may be modified, extended, enlarged or amended from time to time by mutual agreement and consent of the Parties.

9. SEVERABILITY

If a court of law finds any provision of this Agreement invalid or unenforceable at law for any reason, the remainder of this Agreement shall not be affected, and shall be interpreted so as best to effect the intent of the Parties.

10. AGREEMENT TO PERFORM NECESSARY ACTS

The Assignee hereby agrees and undertakes to perform any further acts and execute and deliver any documents that may be reasonably necessary to carry out the provisions of this Agreement.

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11.ENTIRE AGREEMENT

This Agreement, contains the entire understanding and agreement between the Parties hereto with respect to its subject matter and supersedes any prior or contemporaneous written or oral agreements, representations or warranties between them respecting the subject matter hereof.

12. NONWAIVER

The failure of either Party to exercise any right provided in this Agreement shall not be construed as a waiver its right to subsequently enforce such provision or any other provision of this Agreement.
